Year Group: Nursery Summer term 2017

<u>Mathematics</u>	<u>Literacy</u>	<u>Understanding the World</u>
<p>This term, we will be focusing on number. We will continue to work on recognising, writing and counting numbers to 10 and beyond. We will now be using our number knowledge to work out mathematical problems by measuring and comparing size. Throughout the term, we will be developing knowledge on positional language-linked to the key text.</p>	<p>Nursery will be focussing on short fiction books every week, relevant to this term's topic and will be learning short refrains from these stories. This term, we will also be using our Jolly phonic knowledge to write for different purposes and develop emergent writing. The children will explore both fiction and non-fiction books to know that information can be found in books.</p>	<p>In this area of the curriculum, the children will be learning about the changes in weather and the area around us. As well as learning about foods that help our bodies stay healthy, we will now be exploring Summer cooking. We will learn about ingredients and find out where they come from. The children will also complete a simple programme on the computer linked to the topic.</p>
<u>Expressive Arts and Design</u>		
<p>This term, the children will be learning the names of Primary and Secondary colours. They will also explore techniques for gluing, cutting and sticking a range of materials. The children will have an opportunity to use these techniques to create a collage of the environment around us. In addition, they will use construction toys such as Duplo, Mega Block and Lego to construct and design models. Throughout the term, the children will have an opportunity to engage in imaginary play in the Home Corner, our new train station and many other Small World activities.</p>		
<u>People and Communities</u>	<u>Physical Development</u>	<u>PSED</u>
<p>Children in Nursery will be learning to show care and concern for others and continue to establish positive friendships with their peers and adults. They will also carry on learning about the lives of different children. We will now start getting children to think about adapting to changes as the majority of the children will be moving onto reception in new term.</p>	<p>This term, the Nursery children will be learning to balance and climb using the large equipment in the garden. This will be alongside hand eye Co-ordination and moving with control. Moreover, we will be working on fine motor activities to develop your child's ability to use a variety of tools, including scissors and pencils. We will be encouraging them to use a variety of mark making resources i.e. chalk, crayons, charcoal to develop their hold and control.</p>	<p>This term, the children will be learning how to play together, co-operate with each other and share toys. They will learn to gain confidence to in speaking out loud in a familiar group, learn how to listen to others and know when it's their turn to talk. Children will further be encouraged to select activities & use resources independently.</p>
<u>U the W -ICT</u>	<u>Homework</u>	<u>Information</u>
<p>Children will be learning to complete a very simple program on Espresso to support their learning of Literacy, Maths and all the other areas of development. Later, the children will learn how to manoeuvre and control the computer mouse.</p>	<p>The Nursery Children will continue to take their Busy Bee work book home every Friday. This will provide you with an opportunity to engage with a simple 15-minute activity to support your child's learning.</p>	<p>Our Nursery library is always open for parents and children to borrow and take books home to read.</p>
