<u>Mathematics</u>	<u>English</u>	<u>Science</u>
<p>This term the pupils will continue to follow the Revision Programme in preparation for SATs. They will develop their mastery of mathematics pupils will have varied and frequent practice to build fluency, develop reasoning skills and apply their knowledge in a range of contexts. Number work will be a big focus as well as times tables quick recall, fractions, decimals and percentages. Pupils will also be revising measures including length, capacity, weight and time.</p>	<p>This term the pupils will continue to follow the Revision programme in preparation for SATs. They will revise skills of inference and reasoning in reading; practise retrieving information from texts by close reading and skimming texts; commenting on the effect of language and the intention of the author. They will revise all aspects of grammar and punctuation and develop their writing skills through a range of contexts including recounts, narratives, summaries, letters and diaries.</p>	<p>Our Science topic this term is 'Electricity'. Pupils will be given opportunities to investigate which materials are good conductors of electricity. They will be encouraged to make predictions about the effect of including additional batteries in a circuit. Pupils will be able to investigate how to change the brightness of a bulb and the speed of a motor in a circuit.</p>
<u>Art/DT</u>	<u>Humanities</u>	<u>Physical Education</u>
<p>In Art pupils will be designing pieces of work linked to their History topic- 'The Magna Carta'. In D.T we will be looking at food technology which will involve us exploring where our foods come from, making our own bread and designing packaging for its transport.</p>	<p>In History this half term, pupils will learn about 'The Magna Carta'. Who was responsible for its creation? Who did it affect? What security did it provide for the people of England? Pupils will consider how life might be different now if the Magna Carta had never been introduced and its impact on our current laws.</p>	<p>This term in P.E, Year 6 will be developing their skills in Netball. They will focus on throwing and catching; aiming and turning to develop speed and agility. Pupils will be encouraged to develop teamwork and leadership skills through effective communication and strategy development.</p>

<u>Religious Education</u>	<u>Music</u>
<p>The Topic of study this term in R.E is 'Celebrations'. Pupils will learn how different religions and groups create celebrations; recognise similarities and differences between celebrations and identify key features of celebrations in a variety of cultures.</p>	<p>This term pupils will continue to access their ECAM music tuition focussing on the violin, flute and keyboard. These sessions will take place on Friday's so please encourage the pupils to remember to bring in their instruments every week as well as practise at home. This will help them to achieve their full potential in music.</p>
